FOREWORDS

The past year has been marked by significant achievements and developments for our school. A notable highlight is the exceptional academic performance of our 10th-grade students in the Haryana Board examinations. The results exceeded the expectations of the management, teachers, and parents. Out of 41 students who appeared for the exams, 28 achieved merit status, 12 secured first division, and one student obtained second division. This remarkable success is a testament to the divine grace of Sai, which has evidently influenced our students. There has been a noticeable shift in their attitudes, with students, particularly those in higher classes, becoming more focused and dedicated to their studies.

Our emphasis on teacher training has also been a key focus this year. Training initiatives have been undertaken in three main areas:

1. Enhancing spoken and written English language skills
2. Introducing the concept of High Order Thinking (HOT) questions
3. Training by the National Council of Sri Sathya Sai Schools in the philosophy of Sai Educare

This year, our school underwent a comprehensive "Accreditation 2.0" process conducted by the National Council of Sri Sathya Sai Schools and was awarded an "A" grade. The Council has identified areas for improvement to achieve an A+ grade in the future, and the school management and our dedicated teachers are diligently working towards achieving this goal.



In the field of sports, the boys' Basketball team won the U-19 district championship. Additionally, our school has been recognized as a "wrestling" nursery for boys, with 30 students

receiving training in this traditional sport. The sports department has provided a coach and necessary equipment. The trainees will receive a monthly stipend ranging from ₹1200 to ₹1500, depending on their age group, directly into their bank accounts.

The health unit continues to provide invaluable service to the community by offering honest and ethical medical advice. The drug store, which sells generic medicines, has been a significant support to the patients. One patient shared with the canteen staff that the cost of medicines for 15 days at our facility was equivalent to just two days' worth of medicine purchased from outside.

1. Introduction and brief history

Sri Sathya Sai Gramin Jagriti Sewa Sadan is a multi-dimensional rural based service (*sewa*) project gifted by Bhagawan Sri Sathya Sai Baba to the northern part of rural India with the dual purpose of self-evolution of the volunteers (*sewa* workers) through selfless service and empowerment of the beneficiaries through the various services of this project. It bears the name of Bhagawan Baba, because it follows the lofty Sai principle of “selfless service” with “love” as a mode of liberation. The project came into existence with a typical stamp of Swami’s *leela* which is no less than a miracle in itself.

It was in 1990 when Lord Sai blessed one of His outgoing MBA students of Sri Sathya Sai Institute of Higher Learning and inspired him to work in setting up of a multi-dimensional rural empowerment programme. The “*sewa*” work in this project was started on 13th April, 1993. Since then, **Swami** has been guiding, inspiring and protecting us at every step. Important physical milestones in the history of this project are as follow:

Important milestones: *Bhoomi Puja* of the land, gifted by the then Gram Panchayat of village Darwa (Yamuna Nagar, Haryana), was performed on 13th April, 1992. Foundation of the hospital building was laid on 27th September, 1992. The *sewa* work in the project was started in the form of a **dispensary** on 13th April, 1993. Next year in September 1994, *Masala* (spices) production centre was commissioned with a view to provide vocation to economically weaker section of the rural women.

Sri Sathya Sai Jagriti Vidya Mandir was inaugurated on Swami’s 71st Birthday (23rd November, 1996) by a long time Sai devotee -Mr Justice R.Sridharan, the then Chief Justice of Punjab & Haryana High Courts.

The “Parshotam Loomba block” of 6 bigger rooms in a 3-storey format, specially designed for housing a Sai Mandir, conference hall, library, science laboratory and a computer laboratory, was completed in 2009.

The major boost to the working of the Project in general and Sri Sathya Sai Vidya Mandir in particular, was received on 19th June 2010 when **Sri Sathya Sai Vidya Vahini** was gifted to school by Bhagawan. This has brought in the cutting edge of latest technology in secular (text book) and value-oriented education for the holistic development of the students’ personality.

“**Sai Kitchen**” was commissioned in September 2012 to supply freshly prepared, tasty and nourishing vegetable curry every day to all the students free of cost.

On Baba's 88th birthday (23rd November, 2013), a multi-purpose assembly hall (**Sai Balraj Gupta Hall**) was inaugurated by Mr Justice K.C Puri, Hon'ble Judge of Punjab & Haryana High Courts, Chandigarh.

With Sai's loving grace, the school has been affiliated to the National Council of Sri Sathya Sai Schools in 2013. **Thank you, Swami!**

In April 2015, the sports ground of the school was developed fully into a stadium for training and organising the games of foot-ball, hockey, Cricket, volley ball and track events. A state of the art, Basketball court was commissioned in March 2016.

In 2017, the extension of the Balraj Gupta Assembly Hall and addition of a balcony was undertaken to accommodate the ever-increasing audience, attending Baba's birthday and school Annual Day programme.

In April 2018, a 10KW "on-grid" **solar power plant** was installed on the roof top of the school. The plant is generating more power than the requirement of the Sadan. It has now been upgraded to 15 KW to meet the increasing energy demand of the Sadan.

In April 2022, the Diagnostic lab was upgraded with state-of-the-art equipment and In July 2022, a generic medicines drug store opened to sell generic medicines at low cost.



On 13th April 2020, a new facility of Patients' waiting area cum canteen was inaugurated. AC has been fitted to make their wait comfortable.



With Sai Grace, the growth of the "Vut Vriksha" sapling received from Puttaparthi, seems to be in tandem with the growth of the project.

2. The Society

2.1 Membership:

The society is registered with the Registrar of Societies & Firms, U.T- Chandigarh in 1990. There is **no membership fee**, only contribution of “*Pure Love*” is required for Life time Membership of the society. As on this day, there are 44 members on the rolls of the society. We lost two members recently. None of the members or their relatives is gainfully employed in the project. The services of the members are purely selfless in nature and no remuneration/perk in any form is ever paid to any of the members. Full list of members/Governing body members is given on pages 59-62 (annexure IV). Commissioner, Yamunanagar Corporation and Director Urban Local Bodies Haryana are the permanent nominees of the Govt. of Haryana in the Governing Body of the society.

2.2 Funding:

The society receives unsolicited donations in its scheduled Bank accounts and no donation box has been kept to receive loose cash donations. The payments of all purchases etc. are made on regular bills. The salaries of the teachers and other staff members are credited to their bank accounts directly. At the end of the financial year, the accounts are audited by a chartered accountant. The balance sheets; receipts & expenditures statements and audit report (please see Annexure V, page 63 onwards) are prepared and presented in the Annual General Body meeting for its approval. An analysis of the data of this balance sheet and comparison with last two years is, however, presented in chapter 9 of this report (page 42-45).

3. The Project

3.1 Theme of the Project is reset: The theme of the project was initially conceived to be “*Manav Sewa is Madhav Sewa*”. But this theme has since been reset by Bhagawan Sri Sathya Sai Baba on 02-01-2011 during the last interview, graciously granted to the management committee members, when Swami emphatically told them, “**If you love me, love my words**”.



3.2 Location of the Project: The project centre is situated on the bank of Yamuna canal, 7.5 kms from Yamuna Nagar on old Saharanpur (*Jhhota*) road at village Darwa in Tehsil Jagadhri of Yamuna Nagar district (Haryana) Pin 135101. The village Darwa has now been included in Yamuna Nagar Corporation, but the project work continues to serve the rural neighbourhoods.

3.3 The Beneficiaries:

The project has two types of beneficiaries:

Adopted: Three villages are adopted for *sewa* activities:

1. Darwa with population:	1095
2. Darwa Majri with the population:	1162
3. Parwalon with the population:	<u>1693</u>
Total adopted Population:	3950 (Families=520)

In an economical survey of the adopted families, it was observed that 12% families are having good regular income from the farms or regular employment, 36% families are living on income from daily wages or irregular employment and the rest 52% are living “below poverty line”.

All the services rendered by the *Sadan* are totally free to the population of these three adopted villages.

Non-adopted: Besides the adopted beneficiaries, unspecified number of patients from the surrounding and far off villages/cities of Haryana, Punjab, Uttar Pardesh, Himachal and Utranchal, visit *Sadan* every day for free consultation. The poorest of the poor amongst the non-adopted patients are also provided free medicines and investigations. Subject to the availability of the seats, students from various non adopted surrounding villages are admitted to the school through a transparent open lottery system.

Quality (and not the quantity) is the hall mark of all the activities.

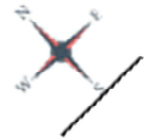
3.4 Components of the Project:

There are three wings of the *Sadan*:

1. Education Wing- Sri Sathya Sai Jagriti Vidya Mandir
2. Health wing
3. “Masalas” Production centre

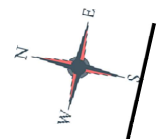
These three wings derive their inspiration and energy from the fountain head of energy that is- “The Spiritual Activities”.

The satellite panoramic views of the project site



The circled area depicts the project site. Out of the total area of 7 acres of the land in possession, the school premises is in 4.17 acres (60%) and the remaining 2.83 acres (40%) has the Hospital and residential premises.

On the northern side of the campus, is Darwa dairy complex, on the southern side; there are farms and Yamuna Canal. The eastern side, the vacant land is reserved for the society to expand its project and Darwa village is on the western side of the project site.

4. Sri Sathya Sai Jagriti Vidya Mandir -a “Sri Sathya Sai Vidya Vahini”, “Sai School”



Highlights:

- Regular co-educational bi-lingual school from pre-nursery to 10th class, recognised by Govt. Of Haryana and affiliated to Board of School Education Haryana, providing a high quality, but totally free quality education to the rural students.
- Special emphasis on “Education in Human Values”-Sai Educare
- The introduction of the newer concept of “Experiential learning”
- Clean, safe and hygienic environment with provision of safe drinking water, separate toilets for boys & girls.
- Qualified & trained teachers with teacher/student ratio as 1:21. Specialist teachers in Science, Sanskrit, Music, Computer Science, Physical training and a Librarian. Regular in-service training for the teachers.
- Thirteen (13) e-class rooms: each having LCD projector/LED HD Smart TV, screen, green board and Wi-Fi /LAN internet connectivity for free access to the vast teaching material available on Sri Sathya Sai Vidya Vahini LMS Portal.
- Well-equipped science and computer labs. Facilities for LCD, slide and overhead projectors. A well-stocked School library.
- Well organised school annual calendar for sports, co-curricular activities and community services.

“No More Boring Walls “



Under this project, teachers and children are encouraged to paint the murals on the walls depicting IIEP (Insightful, Inspiring, Enjoyable, and Participative) principles. This activity brings out their creativity and devotional attitudes towards their work. Above pictures have been taken from the corridors and entry gate passage of the school.

- Regular health check-up with 100% free immunisation against Hepatitis A Hepatitis B and MMR. Regular Vit D + Calcium supplement for all. Free supply of freshly prepared vegetable curry with rice from Sai Kitchen.
- Parental involvement (Parenting) in overall personality development of the children by regular Parent-Teacher Meetings.
- Post-schooling career counseling and financial/logistic support including gifting Laptops to meritorious students pursuing higher studies.

With loving grace of Bhagawan Sri Sathya Sai Baba, Sri Sathya Sai Jagriti Vidya Mandir has been declared as a “light House School” after a detailed audit by Sri Sathya Sai Vidya Vahini Foundation.

To explore this fountain head of gifted “knowledge”, the school is adopting the system of Sai Educare. Under this system, an equal and balanced importance is given to both “secular” (board syllabus education) and “EHV” (Education in Human Values). According to Sri Sathya Sai Baba, both of these components of child development are like the two wings of a flying bird, essential for him/her to fly in the mundane world.

Education is for Head, and Educare is for Heart!

Sri Sathya Sai Vidya Vahini programme and affiliation to Institute of Sathya Sai Education (Mumbai) are providing the technology and continuing training to the teachers, thus giving impetus of achieving the goal laid down in Sai philosophy of education- “Sai Educare”

The importance of moral education is the basic principle of the Sai Education philosophy. *Bhajan* singing and *Vedas* recitation are the regular features of the Morning Assembly. With the Institute of Sathya Sai Education (Mumbai) taking over the school under its wings; the new concept of “Experiential Learning” has been introduced in the school. Sincere efforts are being made to develop the “Character” of the young ones by an integrated approach involving students, teachers and parents through medium of “LOVE”, balanced with “Law”.

Infrastructure: With Loving grace of Sri Sathya Sai Baba, the school management has been able to build a state-of-the-art infrastructure for the children to bloom into useful individuals. There are thirteen (13) e-class rooms for the senior classes, each having a LED projector, internet accessibility, dustless chalks and green boards. The school has an assembly hall, a well-equipped Computer lab, a composite science lab, a mathematics lab, a well-stocked library and a “Rainbow” room wherein projects models and charts prepared by the students in the past, are stored.

SOLAR POWER PLANT



An “On-grid” 15KW Solar Power plant has been installed on the roof top of the school for meeting the power demands of the Sadan and reduces the electricity bill. The plant can be remotely monitored on line.

SAI BALRAJ GUPTA ASSEMBLY HALL



With the grace of the Loving Lord, the multipurpose assembly hall construction is a boon to the infrastructure created in the school. Having LED projector, it serves to host all the school activities such as Baba’s birthday & Annual day celebrations, *bhajan* sessions and indoor games like badminton, table tennis etc.



The conference room, the computer lab and the Balraj Gupta Assembly Hall have also been provided with LED projectors. Sports grounds for football, hockey, athletics and Volley Ball already exist. Basketball court is an added asset in the school.

The library has a stock of the library has a stock of 4021 books. (Reference books 1240, Academic: 1284, Story: 565, Spiritual: 745, General Knowledge: 60, Moral Science: 24, Magazines: 103). There is a qualified librarian who manages the working of the library.

All class rooms are connected with the Headmistress office through PA system. Security CCTV cameras have also been installed in class rooms and corridors.

The student

During the academic year of 2023-24, the total strength of the school was 447 students, with 47.2% boys and 52.8% girls. Most of the students (84.6%) were from socio-economically backward classes. Although there is no caste-based discrimination of students in the school in any manner yet the detailed break up is given below to meet the information requirement of the Education department under RTE.

The primary classes follow the Haryana Board curriculum in English medium. But, in an effort to bring these rural students at level ground with urban children in competing for admission to professional courses, the medium of instructions for the subjects of Mathematics and Science of 1st to 10th classes have been changed to English. The medium of instruction for the subject of Social Studies is being gradually changed from Hindi to English. Sanskrit is, however, a compulsory subject for all the students. There are two sections, separate for boys and girls, in each of 8th, 9th and 10th classes.

The school computer laboratory has 16 computers for a class of 35 students. Use of computer technology under the aegis of Sri Sathya Sai Vidya Vahini has not only made the subjects interesting and comprehensive for the students, but it is also inculcating the “moral values” in them.

(The infrastructure)



Connection to the modern world: The fully Air-conditioned Computer Lab is equipped with 16 computers wherein the students learn how to make the presentations (ppt's), prepare Excel sheet, write in MS Word and also search material for their different subjects. A qualified teacher has been employed to guide & help them. The whole school building is Wi Fi enabled for optic fibre BSNL internet

The library is a garden of silence for the students to comprehend and expand their knowledge by reading books on various subjects. The school library is very spacious and well lit. It has a stock of 4021 books.



The SSSVV e-class rooms: All the classes have been fitted with either LED projector or HD smart LED TV, each class room also has a green board. Children are taught the subjects using updated educational videos and lessons down loaded from Sri Sathya Sai Vidya Vahini LMS portal.

4.1 Academics: The Academic year started with “shala Parvesh ceremony The day began with the sacred Hawan Ceremony. Our newly appointed Science teacher Shri Kawal deep (Math teacher) and Shri Abhilash (Music teacher) were the Yajmaan of the day. The students from 6th to 10th class attended the Ceremony.

The working day in the school were 248 days during the year 2023-24.

The **Teacher /student ratio was healthy at 1:21** with 21 qualified and experienced teachers for 447 students. To encourage healthy competition among the students, **Balraj Gupta Medal** is awarded to the best outgoing student of the school every year. Based on well-developed protocol of selection, it carries a cash award of ₹11000, a merit certificate and a “Medal”. Miss Preeti, daughter of Smt Rekha and Dharamveer from Village Darwa, was awarded this coveted prize this year. She is the national level football player.

The average attendance of the students during the year was as follows:
In Pre School: 92.3% and In School (1-10 classes): 92.9%. This attendance averages are low. The school administration is working on it to improve the figures.

4.7 Veda Chanting: Baba, who is the Veda Purusha, has educated us time and again on the supreme benefits of chanting Vedas. Every activity gets started

with Vedic chants which leave the whole place charged with divine vibrations. In fact, “Veda Chanting” has become an integral part of His education system. The last 10 minutes before the school dispersal, mass “Sai Gayatri mantra” is recited by all the students and teachers. Veda chanting training is imparted by Mr BALASUBRAMANI CHANDRASHEKHAR (popularly known as Mr CBS Mani) by his biannual visit to the school and weekly online Veda chanting classes.

4.8 School Health Programme:

The health of each student is monitored by maintaining his/her health card. Besides regular medical/dental check-up and deworming of the school children twice in a year, all new admissions were immunised against Hepatitis A and Hepatitis B and MMR (Measles, Mumps and Rubella), thus achieving 100% immunisation in the school. The anaemic children are given oral iron on regular basis. Every student received Vitamin D and Calcium supplement on 95 days in the calendar year. The results of these health providing programmes are encouraging in terms of gain in height, alertness and mental ability of the students. Mid-day meal is provided by Sai Kitchen” to all the students free of cost.

4.9 Visit to Haridwar : (5th November 2023)



An Educational trip to Haridwar went on 5th November (Sunday). A total of 26 students, consisting of 17 boys and 9 girls, accompanied by 5 dedicated teachers went by

a private contracted bus. Notably, Sh. Bhatia Sir also joined the group to provide his valuable guidance throughout the trip. They visited Patanjali Yogpeeth, Swami Sarvanand Ghat, Bharat Mata Mandir, recently build Vaishno Devi Shrine, and finally offer prayers and sang bhajans at Parmeshwari Mani dweep Dham(Jangla Wale Mata Temple). It was an inspiring and enriching pilgrimage.

SCHOOL HEALTH PROGRAMME



“Sai Kitchen” was commissioned in September 2012 to provide freshly prepared nutritious and tasty vegetable rice curry, prepared under the most hygienic conditions, for all the students during their Tiffin time free of cost.

The impact of this activity, inspired by Sri Sathya Sai Baba, is positive on the health of the children. They are eating well with the availability of fresh and tasty vegetable curry with rice.



The other health caring programmes for the school include regular biannual medical/dental check-up, 100% immunization of all the students against Hepatitis A and Hepatitis B and MMR (Measles, Mumps and Rubella). The anaemic children are given oral iron on regular basis. The teachers are also covered for immunization against Hepatitis B and Iron + Calcium supplement .

4.16 Extending help.

- Child adoption scheme: Any student who has either lost his/her father or whose mother has been deserted by her husband, was adopted under the “child adoption scheme” for the purpose of providing free books, uniform/shoes and board examination fees. This year, ten (10) such students had been adopted. Donors from U.K are adopting these children on regular basis.
- Providing books, shoes and vision correcting glasses on regular basis to all those students who cannot afford.
- Laptop computers: Till now, 17 (three this year) laptop computers have been gifted to deserving ex-students, pursuing professional careers.
- Career counselling: Regular meetings with these students are held. Such meetings provided the opportunity to counsel them on their problems encountered by them while pursuing higher studies and also to guide them for their future career. Logistic support is also given to these students in “online” filing of applications, seeking of results and guiding in admission process to various professional courses.
- Financial support was given to economically poor students to pursue their higher studies. Prerna, Shivani and Tanu are receiving financial support for B.Sc (Nursing). Details are given on page 58.

The Teacher

4.11 Teacher’s training and their other activities: There has been emphasis to impart in-service training to school teachers under the philosophy of Sai Educare. The teachers are sent for various workshops/conferences whenever conducted by Sri Sathya Sai Vidya Vahini at Puttaparthi and Institute of Sri Sathya Sai Education in Mumbai on regular basis.

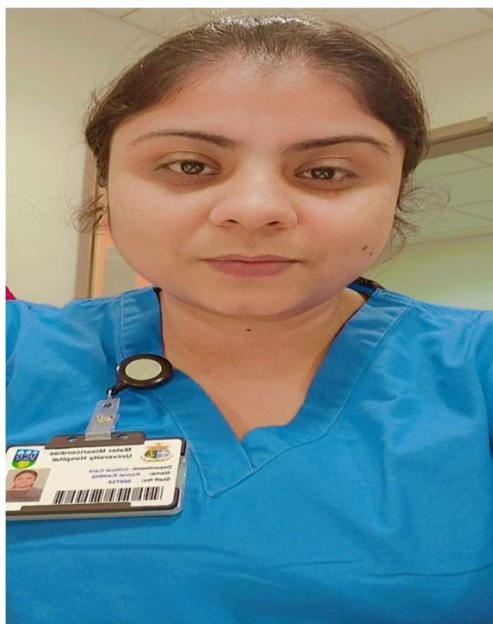


The other teacher’s related activities are, however, highlighted below:

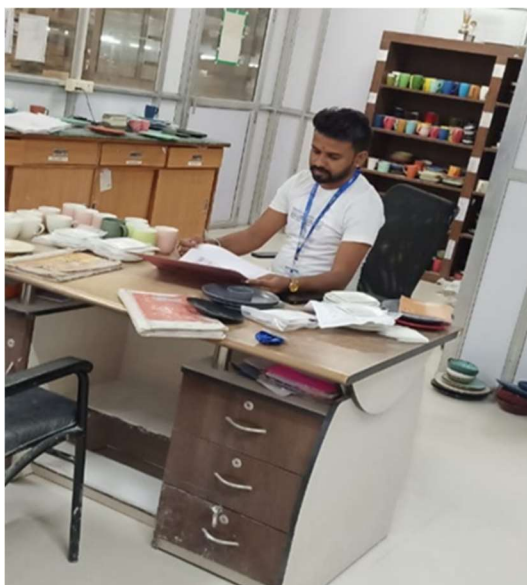

A report on KYP Program

In January 2024, under the visionary leadership of Shri B.B. Gupta, our school embarked on an innovative initiative called 'Know Your Parents' (KYP). This pioneering program aimed to foster a deeper understanding between teachers and parents through personalized phone calls. The primary objectives of KYP were:

1. To gain insight into the family culture.
2. To understand the daily routine and habits of the child
3. To offer guidance and counselling to parents on effective ways to support their child's development at home

Additionally, the program suggested practical remedies, such as regular chanting of the Gayatri mantra, to promote a conducive learning environment.

This initiative proved to be a dual blessing, as it not only enabled teachers to gain a better understanding of their students (KYC) but also provided an opportunity to assess the writing skills and reporting abilities of the teachers made to know the teachers (KYT)

Parenting Sessions:

A parenting session was taken on.

Headmistress, Smt Himani Sharma talked with the parents on various issues like-

- *Importance of breakfast for children
- *Healthy family atmosphere must prevail inside the homes
- * Use of mobile phones by the children must be prohibited.
- * There should be good bonding between parents and children.
- * Fathers should avoid abusive language as it affects the child psychology.
- * Parents have to co-operate in studies of children. Be strict for study timings at homes.



A special Parenting Session was conducted by Sh BB Gupta.

He met the parents of Class 10th students and with the parents who send their wards for tuitions to the local village tutors separately.

He guided the parents to be the friends and good caretakers at the timings of board examinations. He advised them to take care of their nutrition also.

Secondly, he talked to the parents and told them that there is no requirement of tuition if the child has the habit of self-study and good classroom concentration.

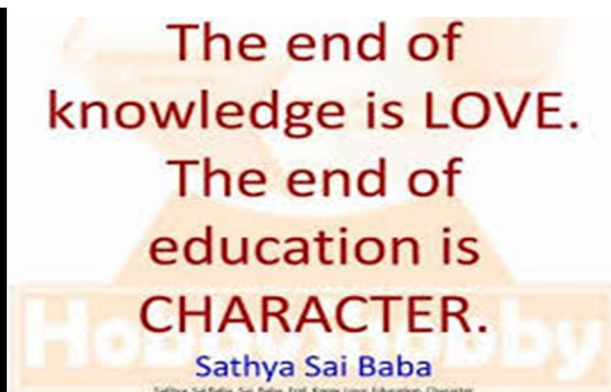
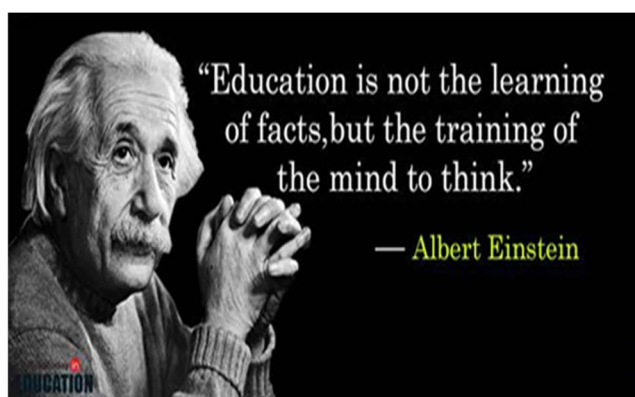
He made them aware that their children are wasting time at the tuitions as the tuition teacher also could not fully pay attention to the individual child. He asked the parents to take the help of school teachers for queries and help.

PTM

Parent Teacher Meetings (PTM) are held from time to time throughout the session, specifically after the Periodic Tests. During the meeting, teachers give the academic reports of the students to their parents. Also, they are being guided for regularity, punctuality, health and hygiene. Parents also share their issues regarding the children with the teachers.

4.13 Scope for Improvement:

- In general, the students lack interest in their studies. They don't engage in "self-study" at home. There is a scope for improvement in their written and spoken languages. The children lack etiquettes and respect for elders which need to be looked into. The students require regular training in improving their personal hygiene.
- Now, since the students have started getting admissions to professional colleges, they feel handicapped because of poor communication skills and lack of confidence.
- The involvement of Parents in the child development could be further improved by regular counselling of the parents.
- The teachers need to work harder to improve their teaching skills and make the subject lively, using teaching aids and free discussions.



HEALTH WING



- Regular OPD for 5 hours daily from Monday to Friday and 3 hours on Saturday, manned by 2 qualified and experienced doctors.
- 300 mA digital X-Ray machine, ECG machine and state of the art Laboratory facilities for routine laboratory investigations and full range of Physiotherapy equipment, manned by locally trained personnel.
- Regular Specialist clinics, once in fortnight for Internal Medicine and Dental patients run by qualified doctors. Daily Orthopedics and Gyne. Obst clinics.
- School Health Programme
- A “24X7” Ambulance service for the adopted population.
- Generic Medicine Drug store

5.1 The beneficiaries:

Two types of beneficiaries are attending the Out Patient Department for seeking free medical consultation. Their beneficiary status and entitlement are tabulated below:

The hospital building houses the outdoor medical examination facilities with provision for X-Rays, laboratory, dispensary and a generic medicine drug store. Four beds are available for observation of the patients. The patient waiting area and a canteen also exists in the hospital premises.

Specialists' clinics: A state-of-the-art Dental Chair has been installed to provide treatment to the dental patients. Besides the dental clinic, special clinics for "Internal Medicine" is also run in the evenings. Prior appointments are given to the patients for these clinics. Orthopaedics and Gynaecology - Obstetrics consultations are available on daily basis in the morning times. Emergency services are provided round the clock for adopted patients only. The serious patients are transported to hospitals/nursing homes in the nearby twin cities of Jagadhri/ Yamunanagar.

Looking at the difficulties faced by the patients coming from far off places to avail the token system, a new successful system of telephone booking of tokens has been introduced through a dedicated contact number.

5.2 Out Patient work:

The Outpatient starts at 8 am in the summers and 8.30 am in the winters with *Aunkaram* and Veda Chanting, followed by "*Sarva Dharma Prarathana*". The *Vibhuti Parsadam* is then distributed and the patients are made to sit comfortably, men and women separately. The patients are seen on first-come-first-serve basis using a digital token display system. The adopted patients, toddlers and senior citizens (>65 years of age) are given priority.

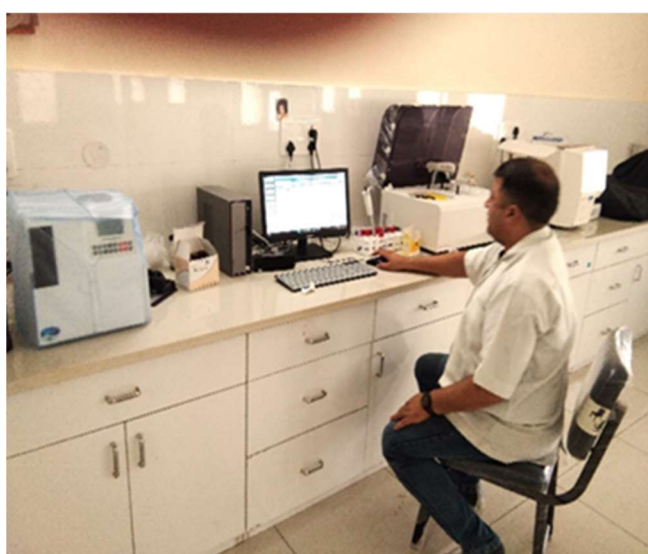

Considering that there were 298 working OPD days during 2023-24, the average number of patients attending the OPD per day was 65, with percentage of adopted patients as 47.4% of the total OPD registration.

HEALTH UNIT



Sadan has a humble “health Wing”, mainly the OPD, dealing all patients with love and compassion. The wing has earned a name for fair dealing and positive approach. Patients come for free consultation from far off places of UP, Utranchal, Haryana & Panjab. Popularly known as “Sai Baba Ka hasptal”. A large number of orthopaedic patients come for balanced opinion and treatment. The unit has a clinical laboratory manned by a senior lab technician, a 300-mA digital X-Ray Machine and state of the art Dental chair. There are four observation beds, but the patients requiring Indoor treatment are taken to Nursing Homes in Jagadhari /Yamuna Nagar. Ambulance service is available round the clock for this purpose. For the convenience of patients coming from far off places, telephone booking of token has been introduced

5.3 Anti-tubercular treatment:

Since the beginning in April 1993, a total of 154 patients (average: 05 per year) of tuberculosis (Pulmonary and extra Pulmonary) have been diagnosed in adopted population of Darwa village. The breakup of these cases is as follows:

- *Healed and rehabilitated: 142 *Recurrence: 04 (Treated subsequently)
- *Died due to the problem: 06 *Treatment discontinued by pts.: 01
- * Active case under treatment: 01

While the incidence of Tuberculosis is on the rise all over India, the incidence in village Darwa has been on the decline. Thanks to persistence efforts to persuade the villagers to follow the standard hygienic habits and give up smoking.

Other chronic disease patients who are taking medicines on regular basis are: Hypertension -53, Diabetes Mellitus -10, Epilepsy- 05, Thyroid dysfunction -04.

5.4 Diagnostic Laboratory, ECG and X-Rays:

A state-of-the-art diagnostic facility has been created recently. The equipment was donated by "Round Table" India. It has been manned by a qualified Laboratory Technician to prepare hematology, bio-chemical and Urine analysis investigation reports. Samples for more sophisticated tests are sent to advance Laboratories at Chandigarh/Delhi. An ECG machine is also now available for the Outpatient. The 300mA X-Ray digital machine is having a backup of 25KVA generator as an alternative source of power. As per legal obligation, the Sadan Hospital and the X-Ray technician are registered with Atomic Energy Regulation Board for monitoring the X-Rays exposure to the technician.

5.5 Some facts about rural Health services:

- a) Common ailments: Contrary to the common belief, the rural women are found to be commonly suffering from Hysterical neurosis. Worst of all, the family members don't understand it and get exploited by unscrupulous nursing homes. Second common problem is Epilepsy due to Neuro-cysticercosis.
- b) The problem of alcoholism is taking a toll on the socio-economical milieu of poverty and undernourishment of family members, domestic violence etc. Death in young age due to chronic alcoholism is common. Illegal sale of liquor in the village is continuing in spite of several representations submitted to the authorities.
- c) The quacks ("doctors") are playing havoc with the psyche of the villagers. These "doctors" also work as touts for the nursing homes flourishing on illegal medical malpractice, resulting in unwarranted costly investigations and unwarranted operations such as appendectomies and hysterectomies etc.

HEALTH UNIT - OTHER SERVICES



Generic Medicines drug store has been recently opened to provide low-cost medicines. It has been a boon to the patients.

The Health Unit has full set of routine Physiotherapy equipment like automatic traction machine, SWD, Wax bath, shoulder wheel etc.



There are 4 observation- beds available in the health unit for care of the patients requiring short observations.



The ambulance service is available 24X7 for the adopted patients for shifting the patients to designated nursing homes in Jagadhri and Yamuna Nagar



5.6 The School Health Services: Kindly see health under “Education”.

Calcium + Vi D tablets are given to all the children of the school on regular basis. In all, a total of 22500 tablets (from class IST to Xth) + unspecified sachets of Vit D granules (for pre-school classes) were given during the year.

5.7 Indoor Patients:

As per policy, the patients from adopted villages requiring indoor treatment are admitted to various Hospital/Nursing Homes at Jagadhri/Yamuna Nagar for different problems. Besides, the financial help, these patients are given logistic support in the form of personal visits, arrangement of blood, food and transport. Financial help was given to deserving patients for their sophisticated costly laboratory investigations. A brief summary of these patients is given in Annexure-III (page 58).

5.8 Births and Deaths:

A regular record of births and deaths in village Darwa is kept meticulously (tabulated). The data of births has been useful for keeping the immunization record of all the newly born and also for admission to nursery class of Sri Sathya Sai Jagriti Vidya Mandir.

5.9 Feed Back Mechanism:

A team of doctor and volunteers visit the village every Tuesday and some of the Saturdays for interacting with the beneficiaries with the purpose of getting “feed-back” from them and for their counselling in the matter of health and the education of their children. This gives them the opportunity to update the family data in the Sadan records. The inputs from these visits help in making micro-adjustments in delivery system of the various service activities.

5.10 Drug store : The generic medicine drug store, supplying low cost generic medicines, has proved to be a big boon to the health activities.

6. Jagriti Lok Sewa Trust and its activities:

The management of four service units of the Sadan are outsourced to Jagriti Lok Sewa Trust under an MOU. These centres are:

- 6.1 *Masala* production Centre
- 6.2 Diagnostic Path Lab.
- 6.3 Drug sale point
- 6.4 X-ray unit

The essential features of MOU signed between the two trusts:

1. No trustee will be paid any salary
2. The appointment and termination of the employees and their service conditions will be decided by the trustees of these two trusts.
3. Lok Sewa Trust will pay the salaries, purchase the usable items.
4. After deducting all the expenses, 50% of the net profit will be paid by the Lok Sewa Trust to Sri Sathya Sai Gramin Jagriti Society towards the usage of the premises, electricity, water, security etc.
5. Lok Sewa Trust will provide absolutely free services of X-Ray and Path lab to all the adopted patients. Drugs to the adopted population is dispensed by Sadan doctors.

6.1 Masala (spices) production centre was established in September 1994 with the following aims in mind:

1. To provide vocation to the rural women so that their economy is improved. Three women and a village boy have been employed in the *Masala* Centre.
2. To educate these working women in basic hygiene so as to improve their health.
3. To provide pure high-quality *masalas* (spices) to the society.

Strict control on quality is maintained at the point of purchasing of the raw materials and production. Each packing has a label, indicating the name of the *masala*, its date of manufacture, weight when packed and its cost. In case of any complaint, the material is replaced without asking any question.

The sale is promoted by the members in their social circles, both at Yamuna Nagar and Chandigarh. A sale counter has also been kept in the hospital section which attracts many visitors.

This year, the average monthly salary of ₹3215 has been disbursed to three rural women for their labour working for an average of 2 hrs per day. A comparative data of *Masala* Centre progress over the last 3 years has been tabulated as follows:

6.2 Diagnostic path lab: A state-of-the-art lab has been commissioned with a qualified and experienced technician to carry out the routine diagnostic test. We claim to provide low cost -high quality services.

6.3 Sri Sathya Sai Drug sale point: On receiving the feedback from the high cost of medicines prescribed by the Sadan doctor, it was decided to open a “drug sale point” in the premises. It has been a great success. Patients are feeling blessed with this Sai gift. Many dropped out patients have restarted their treatment. Some of them observed that 15 days drug therapy from these centre = 2 days from outside retail drug stores. Of course, the quality is not compromised.

6.4 Diagnostic x-rays: Basic x-ray facility is available. The radiographer is a local boy trained by the Sadan to receive diploma. The digitalisation of the X-Ray was carried out to improve the output of the services. The charges are one third of the market.

Masala (spices) production centre was established in September 1994 with the following aims in mind: 1. To provide vocation to the rural women so that their economy is improved. 2. To educate these working women in basic hygiene so as to improve their health. 3. To provide pure high quality "hand ground" *masalas* (spices)



The best raw materials of the *masalas* (spices) are procured from the market. The materials are cleaned, grounded and packed hygienically. There is a quality control at each step of the production. A solar drier is used to dry the raw material.

6.5 Employment opportunity: The various wings of the project are providing job opportunities to the adopted population. In the non-technical areas, the jobs are offered to economically weaker families of the adopted population, irrespective of caste or creed. But for the technical jobs, the applicants from the adopted villages are required to compete with others in a merit based open/transparent selection process.

Besides the two doctors working on voluntary basis, there are 48 regular paid jobs available in the project. Out of these total 48 jobs, 29 are occupied by the inhabitants of villagers. One village woman has been engaged to run the *Sadan* canteen.

All the employees are covered under ESIC and EPF schemes.

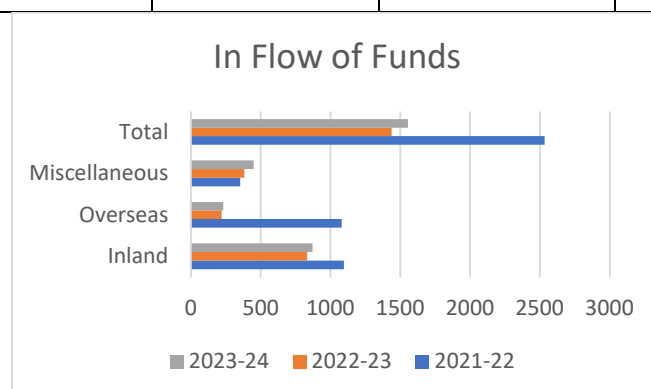

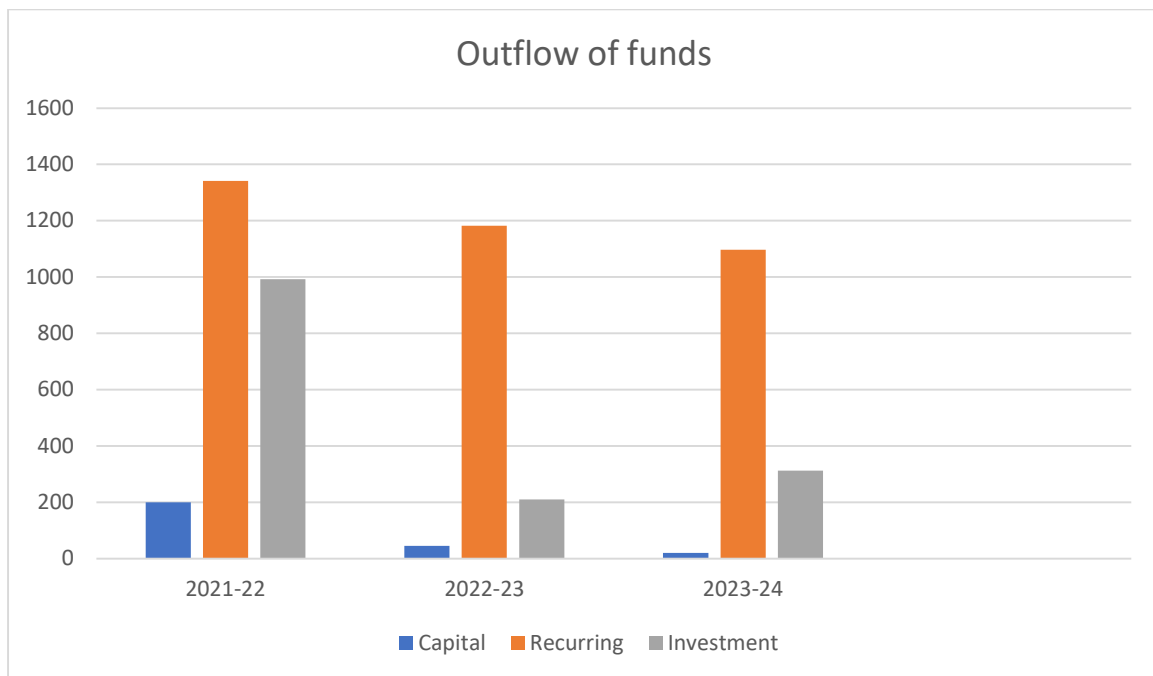
